Grades Kindergarten - Fifth

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GOALS

The goals of the elementary school guidance and counseling program of the Pine Hill Public Schools are to:

1. provide for the early identification and intervention of problems in students to prevent interference with learning;

4. provide classroom guidance activities to foster the goals of the program;
5. consult with parents and others for the mutual sharing and analysis of information and ideas to carryout strategies to help students;
6. coordinate school and community resources for the benefit of students and parents;
7. assist the student, parent, teacher, and/or administrator as necessary for the student to experience a sense of self-worth;
8. coordinate the administration of NJ ASK 3-5 and other local assessment(s);
9. work collaboratively with staff to ensure student mastery of Common Core objectives and student expectations contained in the Pine Hill Public Schools goals and expectations;
10. assist the administrators, teachers, parents, and students in interpreting test scores.

- learning to cooperate and developing a sense of belonging in the educational setting

- improving grades, attendance, and attitude toward school
- distinguishing between teacher-made tests and standardized tests
- understanding the importance of formal testing

- developing effective time management skills
