Dear Parents, Staff, and Students:

As promised in my letter earlier this week, I am writing today with another COVID-19 update. This afternoon, I was notified by the Camden County Department of Health that our region remains in the orange/high risk activity category. Per the New Jersey Department of Health, when a district is in the orange category, guidance indicates that remote instruction should be considered.

At this time, we intend to continue with our hybrid learning schedule. We will continue to monitor the public health data and follow the advice of the county and state health departments.

Given the fast pace of the surge, we are actively preparing to shift to the red/very high risk category which necessitates full remote instruction. I encourage you to familiarize yourself with the [Weekly COVID-19 Activity Reports](#) and the [COVID-19 Regional Risk Matrix](#) to stay informed of the guidelines utilized to determine if a district remains open or closed.
